In 1927 "The Critic" the first pupil's magazine written by the boys for the boys made its appearance. The magazine was reintroduced in 1995 and renamed "The Greyhound". Our first editor, Mark Stacey, wrote the following in that year's editorial.

"I think we all sub-consciously felt that Kearsney was incomplete. We all had an uneasy feeling deep down that something was missing. The Kearsney Greyhound.... is destined to become one of our greatest traditions".
