## *Photo & Film Competition* part of *Culture@KEARSNEY*

**4 to 9 June 2019**

**SECTION 1 - Photography:** There are no limitations on the camera equipment you can use - use what you have, as long as it is capable of producing an image of at least 1mb in size.

### **Category 1: South African Culture**

A **single image** in **colour or black and white**. Culture can be difficult to identify, but can include art, sport, traditional culture, history, festivals or local events.

### **Category 2: Environmental portrait**

A **single image** that captures the subject (**a person**) in their environment, be it their home, workplace or doing what they love.

### **Category 3: Photo Journalism**

A series of **three** photographs in **black and white** that tell a story. The images should capture a news, sport or human interest story.

### **Category 4: Fashion**

A **single image** that focuses on displaying clothing or accessories. The image can be a portrait of a person wearing the clothing.

### **Category 5: Wildlife**

A **single image** featuring live animals, including mammals, reptiles, amphibians, fish, insects, birds, molluscs and arthropods.

## **SECTION 2 - Videography: using a mobile device (e.g. iPad | tablet | cell phone | Go-Pro)**

The clip must not be longer than 30 seconds, must not include nudity, foul language, racism or deliberate violence.

### **Category 6: MOMENTS**

Small moments can tell big stories. This is your chance to be creative. You don't need a professionally directed or edited movie, just a clip that captures a moment or tells a story.

- All entries must be original photographs or films taken between the period 1 December 2018 – 17 May 2019. No archived images or films will be accepted.

- The images remain the copyright of the photographer. The competition reserves the right to publish the images in order to promote or market the competition and winners results.
- The photographers reserve the right to use the submitted images for their own personal use but not to enter the image into any other photographic competition within 6 months of the closing date of this competition.
- Competitor’s entry fee is R100. This fee entitles the entrant to submit **5 images per category**.
