## SA Mathematics Olympiad results

We are delighted to announce that Kearsney has been awarded Top Performing Olympiad School in KZN for the second consecutive year. The Olympiads focussed on problem-solving. Which is very much about taught ability and attitude – something we address in our day-to-day teaching and the enrichment programmes on offer at the College.

We congratulate Jack White for his achievements in the second and third Rounds of the SA Mathematics Olympiad

competition. In the second round he placed in the Top 100 in SA. He received a bronze medal for third place after Round 3 and a certificate of achievement from SAMF. (Photo on page 1).

Our Round 2 results were spectacular overall. Based on the results, students were ranked provincially. Eighteen Kearsney boys featured in the Provincial Honours list - the top 100 students in KZN.

Noah Dammann also achieved this excellent standard.



With the assistance of Shongweni Resource Reserve, the race was efficiently carried out in accordance with COVID-19 protocols set out by Canoeing South Africa. It was encouraging to see over 100 school paddlers competing. Raine Scoular was the lucky winner of a Gara paddle. Andrew Sebire (K1) and Liam Calenborne (K2) both raced in the challenging Umpheta Challenge on the Dusi river. Andrew finished 10th overall in the K1 category. ### Fond Farewell


