

Exceptional Matric Results for Kearsney's Class of 2022

We are pleased to report the outstanding results of the 2022 IEB NSC Examinations. Through their hard work, dedication and discipline, the Class of 2022 has achieved a remarkable set of results and made themselves, their families and their school proud. Congratulations boys.

Kearsney once again achieved a 100% pass rate, with a **98% Bachelor Degree (University Exemption) pass rate**.

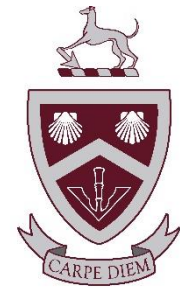
Kearsney has a well-earned reputation for Mathematics and Science excellence and this reputation was reinforced, with 46% of those who wrote Mathematics and 37% of those who wrote Physical Sciences achieving distinctions. This compares to the IEB distinction rate of 26% for Maths and 18% for Physical Sciences for all IEB schools in the country. **This is the twelfth consecutive year that Kearsney's Mathematics and Physical Sciences distinction rates have been approximately double the IEB distinction rates for these key subjects.** The average mark for the Class of 2022 was a remarkable 75% for Mathematics and 71% for Physical Sciences.

Four pupils achieved 8 distinctions, 2 pupils achieved 7 distinctions, 6 pupils achieved 6 distinctions and 9 pupils achieved 5 distinctions. Almost a quarter of our boys achieved four or more distinctions.

Kearsney is proud of its balance and we are delighted that our academic excellence is similarly broad-based. Notable achievements were recorded across the board, including 59% of Accounting candidates achieving an A (average class mark for the subject was 78%), 48% of Drama candidates achieving an A (average class mark of 80%), and 51% of Engineering Graphics and Design (EGD) candidates achieving an A (the average class mark for the subject was 77%).

Congratulations to John Eastes, who made the IEB's Outstanding Achievement list (achieving within the top 5% of all candidates in six or more subjects and a distinction in Life Orientation), and to Benjamin Burton and Fynn Pollock, who made the IEB's Commendable Achievement list (achieving within the top 5% in five subjects and a distinction in Life Orientation).

Kearsney's number one priority is academic excellence. Kearsney boys are immersed in an academically rigorous and inspiring environment from day one and quickly develop academic ambition and a wonderfully positive work ethic. This culture of academic striving, in a disciplined environment, supported by our highly qualified, professional and dedicated teachers, empowers the boys to reach their true potential. As we reflect on the superb results achieved we acknowledge the important role that so many people have played in making this possible.

Some Kearsney highlights:-

- **100% Pass rate and 98% Bachelor Degree (Matric exemption) pass rate** (Bachelor Degree pass rate for all IEB schools of 89%);
- **26% of the Class of 2022 achieved an A aggregate; 58% of the Class achieved an A or B aggregate.**
- 46% of **Mathematics** candidates achieved distinctions (IEB schools' distinction rate: 26%). One boy placed in the top 1% in the country. The **Average Maths mark for Kearsney boys was 75%** (IEB average was 64%).
- 37% of **Physical Sciences** boys achieved distinctions (IEB schools' distinction rate: 18%). One boy placed in the top 1% in SA. Half of the Kearsney boys wrote Physical Sciences, and the average mark was 71% (IEB average was 62%);
- **Twelfth consecutive year** that Kearsney's Maths and Science distinction rates have been approx. double those of all IEB schools;
- 59% of **Accounting** candidates achieved distinctions (IEB schools' distinction rate: 26%). Kearsney's average mark was 78%;
- 51% of **Engineering Graphics and Design** boys achieved distinctions (IEB schools' distinction rate was 32,5%). One boy placed in the top 1% (top 16 candidates) in SA. Kearsney's average mark was 77%;
- 48% of **Drama** candidates achieved distinctions. Kearsney's average mark was 80%. One boy placed in the top 1% (top 15) candidates in the country;
- 24% of Kearsney pupils achieved **4 or more distinctions**;
- 235 Distinctions achieved at an average of 2 distinctions per boy.
